## Top O' Hill Terrace

February 23rd was a beautiful day for an outing! Our visit to the Top o' Hill Terrace, Arlington, Texas, provided the Cadillac & LaSalle club with an opportunity for a wonderful historic tour of the house that once, a long time ago, provided the entertainment for the gamblers and gangsters of the 1930s era. Once known as the Vegas Before Vegas, and originally a pleasant tea room on the Bankhead Highway (now Division Street or State Highway 180), it was turned into a big money gambling casino by gambler Fred Browning. In 1956 the Bible Baptist Seminary purchased the property, which is now the Arlington Baptist College.



Vicki Bryant, museum curator, led our small group had a chance to see the escape entrances and catacombs-like tunnels, hidden rooms under the main building, and a roulette wheel and mementos of the era. The escape tunnels were used when the police were going to raid the casino.

Ann Arnold, wife of NTXCLC member, Bill Arnold, wrote some books about the period. One was *Gamblers and Gangsters: Forth Worth's Jacksboro Highway in the 1940s and 1950s.* It is still available from Amazon and you would really enjoy reading it, being a history of the gamblers during that

time.

The weather was in our favor for a tour of the grounds. Afterwards the club met Richard Cross and Karen Phillips and enjoyed a fine meal at the Arlington Steak House. Note that this restaurant is oldest ongoing establishment in Arlington, Texas. Originally the building was a part of an older train station that ran through Arlington. In the past, the restaurant was known for its gangster affiliation, during the 1930s and 1940s. A room exists on a second floor, where gambling rackets and a shoot out supposedly took place.

The Lincoln Museum across the road has really taken shape since September of last year. The building is now enclosed, and the contractor has the luxury of working in a heated space.
