



April 23, Saturday: On Setup Day the meeting time is 10:00 a.m. at the Cadillac & LaSalle Club-Pate Swap Meet hospitality tent at Andretti and Third Street in Zone 1A (the only tent up). There will be refreshments and water on hand. Be sure to sign the sign-in sheet. Down from gate 4 on Petty Place is the golf carts are stored, in the picket fence area (*"Pet Cemetery"*). We pick up the golf carts and drive them over to Zone 0 where the vendor space marker tile tubs and street signs and poles are stored in the PATE Conex.

Tiles: Each golf cart is loaded with the tile tubs for the zone that is being worked. Note that each cart should have a walkie-talkie, water, and any other refreshments the cart occupants desire. After laying the tiles, the tubs with maps and walky-talkies are returned to the hospitality tent and the golf carts are then returned to the pet cemetery before leaving. Leave cart keys in the carts when parking. They will be collected when we are done.

Signs: The sign crew will also have a cart and will load maps, poles, and signs from the Conex. After posting the signs, return to the Conex to unload any left over items and then drop off the cart in the pet cemetery before leaving.

Lunch: should be served around 12:00 noon at the hospitality tent, so if you are in the middle of your work, drive on in, and then after lunch, complete your mission.

May 1st Sunday: On Pickup Day we meet at 10:00 a.m.at the Cadillac & LaSalle Club-Pate Swap Meet hospitality tent at Andretti Avenue and Third Street in Zone 1A. The swap meet will be winding down, so driving your car to the tent should not be a problem. Be sure to sign the sign-in sheet.

Golf carts will be provided for the activity. Each cart will load up with zone-specific tubs, rubber bands, maps, walkie-talkies, water, and refreshments as desired for tile pickup. A sign crew will use a cart to pick up signs and poles. After the tiles are retrieved, they should be taken to the hospitality tent for final sorting. After sorting the tubs will be taken to the Conex in Zone Zero for storage. Sign materials are taken to the Conex storage.

Lunch should be served around 12:00 noon at the hospitality tent, so if you are in the middle of your work, drive on in, and then after lunch, finish the pickup. When done, leave the walkie-talkies in the hospitality tent.

Golf Carts: Before you leave, the empty golf carts are to be dropped off at the HQ trailer at Petty and West Gate 3. Leave the keys in the carts.

1st Saturday Breakfast Social



ALEX'S BOOK OF 159 CARS

CADILLAC'S "CALAIS" MISUNDERSTOOD OWNER DECEPTION

Vintage and special interest Cadillacs attract enthusiasts wherever they are shown. It's no secret that "every customer matters." Cadillac sales associates are faithful guardians of potential Cadillac owners entrusted to our care regardless of age or era. We need to state the facts as they are. It's never good to mislead a potential buyer into thinking otherwise. To exploit enthusiasts out of their money through lies, falsehoods and other misconceptions to sell a car or make a point of fact is simply wrong!

In 1965 Cadillac introduces the Calais. It looks like a Cadillac DeVille. It drives like a DeVille sharing the same drive train components. However, that is where all similarities end! It is a price leader Cadillac, often poorly merchandized (equipped) that has suggestions of cheap, like taking a hot dog to a banquet! If you understand what you are getting, it's fine. MOST DO NOT. I know as my first new Cadillac was a 1966 Calais Coupe. Fortunately it had factory air as well as a tilt and telescoping steering wheel. A gorgeous Cadillac it was. A Coupe DeVille it was not. I was 25 years old, paid cash and promptly sold it. The Calais looked exactly like a Coupe DeVille until 1971 when the DeVilles became standard with great looking stainless steel rocker panel molding, trim and most had padded tops.



A local prominent Peru, Indiana, businessman approached me to purchase the hot selling

(list price) youthful Coupe DeVille for 1972 of which a staggering 95,280 sold nationally. I gave him a compelling product presentation, memorable demonstration drive and proud facility tour for home of happy Cadillac owners. He said, *Al, I have no trade in, I pay cash and I'm going where I get the best price*. I said, *I never heard that before!* And he laughed. I send everyone a hand written thank you letter in the same day mail and follow up phone call. No response. A few days later, I got him on the phone. He said, *Hey, Al. I like you but I*

beat your deal in Indianapolis (65 miles) by almost \$2,700.00. I said, I've been beaten by a few hundred but never that much. Sorry I missed your business. This is important, what did the car list for, window sticker, MSRP? He said, I don't know. I am a busy guy. They had it prepped fuel ready for immediate delivery and it's loaded, got everything, it's a Cadillac. I replied, Well please bring it by for service or questions of operation. We will treat you like you bought it here.

Six weeks later, he came in for a lubrication servicing with 4980 miles showing. After a complementary hand wash and vacuum, he was livid to point out somehow Cadillac at the factory left off his rocker panel moldings on his Coupe. I said, *No, you bought a Calais so no moldings.* He said, *My courtesy door lights don't work.* I said, *A Calais has*

reflectors. He said, My Calais also has these cheap Chevy loop pile carpets not deep cut pile. My biggest grip is I am audibly peeling my sweating legs off my leather seats. I said, No these are vinyl plastic seats. You can't even order leather on a Calais. Lastly he said, I pinch my legs between the bottom of the steering wheel and the seat. Is there any way to install a tilt and telescoping steering wheel? I said, No. You also have no cruise control, no twilight sentinel, no dual mirrors, no dual comfort seats (not available) and no premium sound. You don't know the

worst of it. When you go to trade or sell it, you are appealing to a very narrow audience. What's it worth if no one wants it? I know you feel you got bagged. They took advantage of your emotions. I don't like it. I have a solution.

He said, I am listening. I continued, Your first loss is your best. Sell it now. I will detail it. You are a heavy smoker so with new trunk and floor mats and cut up air wick under the seats that will kill the smell of smoke, I'll put it on our showroom floor for sale. I have a vendor who owes me a favor. He will install a new factory correct vinyl top, no charge. Within a few days, I sold it to my friend who is a wealthy hog farmer (80,000 hogs in a building) who is also a heavy smoker. I gave him the whispering price. He loved it. He said, I don't care about lacking features. It is an almost new Cadillac with factory air.





You know what it will look like as my field car. I'll take it but I don't have my checkbook. I said, No matter. I will bill you. Here are the keys. He could have easily written a check for the Calais or the dealership! Everyone was happy. My former Calais owner will get one of the first 1973 Coupe DeVilles ordered to suit the Cadillac man!



Clifford C. Wagner was correct when he said, "I've never

seen a bargain in true luxury and most of them have been 'mis-represented'". I raised hell with Cadillac Motor Car Division, many of whom I had grown up with, over continued Calais production.

A Cadillac Cincinnati zone communique letter from by Bruce A. Badger to Beloff Pontiac Cadillac GMC, dated 3 January 1974 revealed our luxury high group analysis of a whopping 30.3% (national average is 24%). In response to my outrage about the continued Calais production, Cadillac strongly urged caution regarding consumer emotionalism and answers and reply to many misleading statements surrounding Cadillacs. Well by 1976 the Calais was finished. From 1967-1976, these are the statistics from Cadillac Motor Car Division Detroit:

- Calais production was 74,059 sold units.
- Cadillac DeVille production was 1,613,852 sold units.
- 1972 Calais Coupe sold 3,900 units.
- 1972 Coupe DeVille sold 95,280 units.

It is a tragedy and disgrace that many of the over 74,000 Cadillac Calais owners were of the impression they bought DeVilles. Their embarrassment for future Cadillac sales is incalculable. Caution: always study the Monroney window sticker. It is required to be there by federal law to protect you in making a competitive purchase. The first year for the Coupe DeVille was 1949, I think. The last year for the Coupe DeVille was 1949. I think.

Alex Cadillac memories: In 1970 I bought a brand new white Cadillac convertible from Tutwiler in Indianapolis. I wanted San Mateo red with white leather and red carpets but there was a six month waiting list for red. In 2009, I found at a private sale a 1970 Cadillac convertible with San Mateo red, white leather, red carpets as you see the car pictured here. I have my buddy Scooby Doo with me and we were a hit cruising Main Street in Grapevine, Texas. This was last year for Cadillac's rear wheel drive 375 hp convertible requiring premium fuel. Only Cadillac had harmonizing carpets. All other sister divisions were black. Nothing makes you feel alive like the top down!






