The Board assumes management and control of the affairs and property of the Club; establishes policy for the Club not otherwise specified by the Constitution; performs all duties usually accorded a board of directors; and at all times acts in the best interests of the Club and its members. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

PRESIDENT: The President shall preside over all meetings of the Board and the membership. He/she shall appoint all committee chairpersons who, in turn shall select their committee members, except the Nominating Committee, of which the President shall appoint all committee members. He/she shall decide all questions of equal division and shall have all powers, authority and duties usually accorded a President.

VICE PRESIDENT: The Vice President shall perform such duties as may be assigned to him/her by the President or the Board. In case of death or absence of the President, He/she shall perform the duties of President.

SECRETARY: The Secretary shall record and keep all minutes of the Board and the annual meetings of the members and mail them to all board members within two weeks after the meetings. The Secretary shall carry on and maintain a file of Club correspondence and shall perform such other duties as the President or the Board may direct.

MEMBERSHIP CHAIRMAN: The Membership Chairman shall actively promote membership in the Club. He/she shall keep an up-to-date roster of the names and addresses of all Club members, send membership applications upon request, process membership applications, receive dues to be turned over to the Treasurer; and he/she shall notify the Board of any Club member whose national dues have not been current for a period of six months.

TREASURER: The Treasurer shall collect funds on behalf of the club for deposit in the club's operating account, and disburse the funds of the Club as directed by the Board. He/she shall keep the region's financial records current and in order at all times and give a report of the club's finances at each regular meeting of the Board. He/she shall render a financial report to the membership at the annual meeting, and to the President and/or the Board as they direct. He/she shall perform such other duties and possess such other powers usually accorded the office of Treasurer, or as the Board may direct.

CADILLAC STATION WAGON AND FUNERARY CREATIONS

It was 1976 and Indianapolis Motor Speedway Center Field Fairgrounds were hosting the Cadillac LaSalle National meet. I judged 1955 thru 1958 Sevilles, Biarritz and DeVilles. Back then, judges were required to have owned or currently own the Cadillacs you pass judgement on. I was stunned by this "never before seen" flawless 1969 Cadillac Fleetwood "4-door hardtop" station wagon displayed. It was my pleasure to capture these rare images. You will note the correct black 1957 Eldorado Brougham in first and second photo. Cadillac Motor Car Division did not produce station wagons. Cadillac, Lincoln and Imperial never had readily available wagons in the showrooms.





Through the NTXCLC, I became friends with John McCall Jr. He congratulated me on my 1st place 1991 RWD Fleetwood in 2009 at Fort Worth meet. John is a very accomplished Dallas attorney and respected judge. Among his unusual stable of Cadillacs was his "featured" 1974 Cadillac Brougham Astro Estate Wagon Dreamboat. Tile Party

John's Cadillac featured the new for 1971 "glide away lift gate / tail gate shown on this Chevrolet Kingswood Estate. A button or key activated exterior switch, retracted the rear window into the roof and the tailgate under the cargo floor. All big GM b-body wagons thru 1976 shared this feature. Thankfully John's wagon had no 1971 only "rust prone" louvers seen here.





1954 GM Motorama Corvette Dream Car "Nomad" Wagon is spectacular. I spotted this seldom seen custom at the Alameda County Fair Grounds CA show in 2002. The tailgate window was power operated.





This 1957 Ford Country Sedan was my step mother Laura Beloff's car and is pictured at Rossford, Ohio, marina in 1961. Note 1956 wagon in background. Dad took great care of this 5 year old ride. The tailgate interior exit was difficult. I drove this wagon when I was on emergency leave from Vietnam.

The 1991 Oldsmobile successful 5.0 liter V-8 custom cruiser wagon. This rear wheel drive new body featured flush glass and vista roof. Buick shared the same body. GM archives



Cadillac is unsurpassed when it comes to creating and supplying the world with "formal" commercial chassis for stretch limos. The presidential beast and funerary hearse vehicles for private customer purpose built creations. This incredibly gorgeous example is owned by Evergreen Memorial Funeral Home of Dallas, Texas. Our own Mark Lucas Kelly told me at Grapevine Rotary that a new hearse was \$115,000.00. Back in Rossford, my Grandmother was right when she said, *My last ride will be a good car, a Cadillac!*










Found this 1957 Cadillac hearse photo in the NTXCLC archives. Remember 1957 is the only year that the fins faced forward on Cadillacs. Note the 1961 Cadillac. This magnificent Cadillac hearse restoration was at the CLC Grand National meet in Santa Clara California in 1999. As a CLC member and judge, I was pleased to take these photos and especially the one of the inside of the hearse. Have you been measured for the final ride - not me yet!

2019 Ridler Award Winner—Detroit Autorama's **greatest award:** The 1959 Cadillac Eldorado Brougham owned by Steve Barton and built by Jordan Quintal II, Super Rides, Escondido, California. The "Cadmad" 16 year project Cadillac wagon began with limited edition "factory custom" hand built by Pininfarina in Italy: Number 85 of the 99 Broughams built in 1959 - length reduced 18.5 inches - body sectioned 2.5 inches - body narrower 4 inches matching "Nomad" roof - Fawntana rose similar to 1961 Cadillac color with pearl metallic - the 1,000 HP 88 mm mirror image turbochargers is a 632 Nelson racing engine - 18" evod wheels resembling factory "deep fluted" design - Vogue tyres - see more photos at www.motortrend.com/features/2019-detroit-autorama-ridleraward-steve-bartons-1959-cadillac-wagon Special thanks to Street Rodder, August 2019, page 70.


