1959 Fleetwood Sixty Special



In 1959, the largest fins appeared on nearly all Cadillacs this year, including the incredible fourdoor hardtop Fleetwood Sixty Special. Now riding a wheelbase of 130 inches and a garagebusting 225 inches long, Sixty Special continued as a pillarless hardtop with its own distinct moldings - including a side-mounted dummy air-scoop on the rear fender, and a thin chrome bead that ran from the front fender back to the rear bumper, and then forward again to the front wheel well. The famous fin-mounted tail lights pods (which were body-colored on lesser Cadillacs) were chromed.

The 4,880 lb car was powered by a 390 cubic inch V8 engine putting out 325 HP (345 with dual carbs) at 430 lbs of torque. It could do 0-60 mph in @10.8 seconds.

Cadillac Motor Car division sold 121,775 Cadillacs for 1959, and only 12,250 Fleetwood Sixty Specials.

Price when new \$6,231. Loaded with every amenity possible, the top of the line Cadillacs featured power accessories like the autotronic eye which automatically dimmed its headlights for the driving convenience of oncoming cars. Other standard power features included vent windows, seats, steering and brakes.

### CADILLAC'S STANDARD OF THE WORLD ENGINEER—ED COLE

Edward N. Cole enrolled at General Motors Institute in Flint, Michigan, in 1930. He excelled so strongly, he was pulled out of classes before graduation by his sponsor, Cadillac, and assigned to "special engineering projects" at Cadillac. Cole became Cadillac's head design engineer in 1943 and was responsible for U. S. Army light tanks "with Cadillac industrial V-8s coupled to H.D. Cadillac hydramatics" and other combat vehicles. Following WWII, he was made Cadillac's Chief Engineer developing Cadillac's legendary 331 cubic inch V-8.

In 1952, Cole was promoted to Chief Engineer for Chevrolet. Heavily

involved in the development of the Corvette sports car, Cole is regarded by many as the father of the venerable Chevrolet small block V-8, which is still in production today. Cole earned a promotion to CEO of General Motors in 1967 serving until his retirement in 1974. Cole held 18 separate patents, one of which was for catalytic converters.

Ed Cole, General Manager of Chevrolet beams with fatherly pride over Chevrolet's revolutionary Corvair (1960-1965) air cooled flat 6, twin carburetors, rear engine inspired by aircraft and tank engines. Corvair was *Motor Trends* "Car of the Year" in 1960! The 1961 700 Coupe sold for \$1,985 and 24,786 found buyers. Cole was the only auto executive to debate Nader. After Cole's plane crash, Nader issued strong praise for the father of the Corvair saying, *The auto safety movement has lost a friend*. Pete Estess, GM of Pontiac Motor Division, gave a heartfelt tribute to Ed Cole. Cole was definitely a legend in the auto industry.





**The Engineering Marvel!** Cadillac, was well established as one of the finest car makers in the world. The 1949 models were largely a restyling of the 1948s. Note: the parking lamps. The real excitement lay beneath the 1949 long hood. All new overhead valve (OHV) V-8 was tested over 1,000,000 road miles. This push rod, wedge-shaped higher compression chambers, shorter stroke boosted thermal efficiency with huge power output and was 200 pounds lighter than predecessors. Style and power, the 1949 Cadillacs were a hit with press and public. Legendary Tom McCahill proclaimed the 1949 Cadillac America's finest automobile to date. *Mechanic's Illustrated* and *Motor Trend* bestowed its first ever Car of the Year. It was one of the world's fastest cars on race tracks around the world eventually reaching the 390, 429, and 1968 astonishing 472 cubic inch.





John O. Grettenberger and I first met when I was one of the top producers at Wayne Stead Cadillac, Walnut Creek, CA. He learned that my Dad had purchased 12 pre-owned, pre-loved Cadillacs during his almost 50 years at L.O.F. Glass, Rossford, OH., and encouraged and influenced countless others to do the same. Did you know, every year double the amount of used cars are sold as compared to new? John discovered my Dad was in a nursing home and personally sent and autographed the complete Cadillac history book to him.

Connie tells me this may be my 40th NTX CLC monthly newsletter since August 2020 with global respondent readers. As she is my producer and co-author, we are grateful. (All articles are on our website www.alexbeloff3.com.) With abiding respect to all, we wish to congratulate Ernest Hemmings Publishing for 70 years. We extend special thanks to Jonathan "Jono" Shaw, Matthew Litwin, *Hemmings, Motor Trend, Car & Driver*, especially Keith Crain, *Automotive News* for a great humanitarian Dolly Cole story. We remain loyal almost lifetime subscribers and endorsers.

The proud owner of this impressive 1968 Pontiac GTO in popular hue Mayfair Maize is our own Past President and current VP of Lone Star Dallas POCI, Tom Brackett. Tom graduated from Northwestern in Chicago, IL., majoring in economics and marketing. He



had a successful career in logistics and distribution in Cincinnati, OH. **Tom's mentor was Ed Cole.** Thanks for alerting me so CLC NTX could print this tribute to him.
