



The Wheels Museum is located on the site of the historic Santa Fe Railroad Steam Engine Service Shops. If it has wheels, it is part of this museum

















The e Event was 1999 CLC Grand National in Santa Clara, California. The photos were taken by author. There was record attendance by open mouthed admiring spectators.








