Many years ago there was a rare and interesting sight—two Cadillac Allantes in the same parking lot, not because of a car show or on a dealer's lot, but because North Texas Region Cadillac & LaSalle club's Christmas party was going on. A Gold Metallic 1987 model (4.1 liter, 170 hp), owned by Ron Fishell was parked head to head to a Montana Blue Metallic 1993 model (4.6 liter, 290 hp), owned by Jim Hanson. There were 3,363 copies of the 1987 built with 245 in the gold, and 4,670 of the Northstar-powered 1993 built, 156 in the blue. A grand total of 21,430 Allantes were created and seen only rarely today. Now check out page 2.

Cadillac Allante

A rare event at the North Texas Region Cadillac & LaSalle Club First Saturday Breakfast this morning. Three 1992 Allantés in one place, an event even our club's former Cadillac salesman, Alex Beloff III admitted he did not recall ever seeing during these car's heyday! Only 1,931 of these were produced during this model year, and three are in this photo taken by Jim Hanson, owner of the black car, one of 253. Ron Fishell owns the rare light blue metallic car, one of 21, and Jeff Pendleton owns the beige metallic car, one of 134 painted that color. In 1992 there were approximately 1000 or more Cadillac dealers in the U.S. That means there were less than two 1992 Allantés per dealer, and according to Alex, most were presold, never sitting on the dealer's lot. That makes this a very rare picture.



From 1989 through 1992 the Allanté was powered by the HT-4500 4.5 later V8 at 200 hp and 270 ft-lbs. It did 0-60 mph in 7.9 seconds. Top speed was 122.mph.


Caddy Girls Luncheon

CADILLAC'S TRUNCATED PARK AVENUE

The 1963 Cadillac Park Avenue characterized this truncated Standard of the World from 1961 to 1963. The psychosis of those at Cadillac manufactured the slim caboose 8 inch shorter rear deck overhang cars based on the Series 62 town sedan called the "Park Avenue". Purists called it the "Short Fat Fanny" Cadillac that found few buyers. The 1961 shrunken rear deck was priced the same as a long deck Sedan DeVille at \$5,498. The short stubby deck sold mostly unsuspecting 3,756 owners. The total Series 62 six window hardtops and Sedan DeVille six window hardtops was 52,631. In 1962, only 2,600 Park Avenues were built. After 1963, the Park Avenue was history. Unlike todays look-alike vehicles, the Cadillac had a

The full size trunk was gone. The spare tire takes much trunk space that would usually **accommodate** 6 passenger **luggage** or 4 big Bertha golf bags. Disappointed Cadillac owners were not prepared for the 8 inch shorter Cadillac Park Avenue.

The 1958 Fleetwood sixty special was the only (other than 57-58 stainless roof Eldorado Brougham) Cadillac to ever feature attractive functional top fender engine cooling grills.

Let's have some fun with music featuring Cadillacs! For years, so much was compared to a Cadillac. Recording artists worked Cadillac into the fabric of their songs.

Crusin past San Pedro late one night, a Cadillac sedan went flying by. The guy beside me said, that's the mark for me. By then the taillights was all you could see. Artist unknown.

Drivin a big long Cadillac . . . Fighten the girls off my back . . . Elvis

The most famous chronicled a street race between a Nash Rambler and a Cadillac. In 1958 the Cadillac was well over 300 hp and the most powerful, popular luxury ride in the GM line. July 9, 1958, The Playmates scored with *The Little Nash Rambler...Beep Beep Beep.* It was #4 on top 40 and sold one million copies and went gold. Not bad for three former students from the Univer-



sity of Connecticut. The Nash Rambler was America's first compact car, light weight and perky 82 hp performers. While riding in my Cadillac, what to my surprise, a little Nash Rambler was following me about one third my size. But the little Nash Rambler stayed right behind; he still had on his brake. He must have thought his car had more guts as he kept on tooting his horn. I'll show him that a Cadillac is not a car to scorn. Beep




Beep! His horn went Beep Beep! Now we're doing a hundred and twenty. As fast as I could go, the Rambler pulled along side of me as if we were going slow. The fellow rolled down his window and yelled for me to hear, "Hey Buddy, how can I get this car out of second gear?!"

Time to prepare for some Cadillac road trips and avoid the hard way to learn humility! Also consider "non-CLC judging Cadillacs" by installing electronic ignition and performance correct white wall radial tires as pictured here on my 1970 Cadillac Fleetwood at Lake Grapevine.



The fresher your spark plugs, the better your mileage. The more efficiently you "burn"

your gasoline, the better your mileage. Worn, fouled, coated or damaged spark plugs waste gas. Fresh new plugs is absolutely not a replacement for a tune up. Worn out electrodes indicate use far beyond recommended manufacturers usage and must be replaced! Also carbon, lead and oil fouling resulted from over rich carburetion, faulty



auto choke, improper octane rating or worn piston rings. Fresh plugs mean better mileage. Champion Spark plugs, Toledo, Ohio February 1976.

At perhaps five to six dollars a gallon on up, you definitely want to conserve your fuel. Worn spark plugs show your engine is not in tune. Get the correct "AC" spark plugs for your Cadillac and a do it yourself 13/16th spark plug socket. Tune-ups can help improve gas mileage when you need it most. Always check



your owner's manual before installation . . . (Replace your engine air filter!) "AC Spark Plug Division of General Motors." May 1974.

Just returned from visit to Joplin, Missouri via Oklahoma City and Tulsa. We "waved" at the Hard Rock Casino in Tulsa! FYI for those going to the CLC Grand National in Chicago via I-35, please be aware that I-35 Northbound and Southbound each has three major construction areas between Windstar Casino and Pauls Valley. Signs say 60 mph but reality was 5-10-20 mph so you had miles of desolation and older vehicles need to avoid over heating. Royal Purple has an additive for lower cooling temps. Also keep a box of extra belts, hoses, clamps, quality jumper cables, flashlight, first aid kit, blanket, tools and fire extinguisher in the trunk. If you are stuck in traffic, remember shifting into neutral with foot on brake helps engine cooling.

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
