The Pate Tile Refurbish Party's purpose is to inspect each vendor's space-marking tile and each tile tub. Each of the 45 tubs has a laminated map of the zone and the blocks assigned for that tub. We place the tiles in the correct tub, in numerical order by blocks (even numbers in one stack and odd numbers in s second stack). Each stack gets a big rubber band to secure it. Missing tiles or unreadable tiles are replaced, using the vinyl film from the roll to make the replacement tile. There are about 13,000 tiles, but the work goes fast and we have fun with the get-together of club members. Refreshments will be provided, along with required supplies. However, please dress appropriately for the weather to be comfortable as we will be outside, and BRING A CHAIR. We need as many of you to come as possible, so mark the date and come on out. As of FEB 18, 2023 there have been over 7,800 spaces sold out of 13,275 available.

### CADILLAC UNBRIDLED DIESELS PLUS THE V-8-6-4 DRAMA

Heated controversial vehicle debates are constant. Countless requests generated this partial response. American passenger diesel engine cars started in 1978. The EPA saga mandated the petrochemical scene regulations. The stoichiometric ratio for gasoline in cars, air fuel combustion is 14.7:1 meaning you can only lean a carburetor so far! The diesel about 50.1 much more efficient and economical. That's why you see huge trucks parked at idle as that is when they are most efficient. High heat of compression . . . 22.5:1 of the 350 V-8 requires no real ignition parts and no tune up.

One of the most common myths that still plagues the GM diesel is that it is little more than a converted 350 gasoline engine. Nothing could be further from the truth. About the only components common to the two engines are the valve covers and the water pump.

The diesel uses completely different block, heads and internals. The journals are visibly beefier and main bearings larger. 1979 models

quick-start glow plugs cut cold start times from 60 to 6 seconds. Now at 105 horsepower at 3200 RPM. New roller valve lifters and a water separator in the fuel tank.

As Mr. Massey's sales manager, I had his undivided attention when I said, If you are serious about having the most successful Cadillac diesel sales in America with virtually zero owner complaints, you must take my experienced Vietnam diesel advice.

First, all new diesel Cadillacs will have the RACOR. Factory in tank water separators can be inadequate. Fuel filter/water separator and this 200 FG removes virtually 100% of

water plus solid contaminants down to one micron in size which is mandatory on all marine gasoline. Important to understand that it is the nature of diesel fuel to attract moisture. You cannot chemically compress water. When you do, you bend connecting rods and push rods.



### CADILLAC UNBRIDLED DIESELS PLUS THE V-8-6-4 DRAMA

Next, order all new Cadillac diesels with a special cold weather package with thermostatically controlled fuel heater and engine block heater. With No. 2 diesel fuel below 20 degrees without warning even at 60 MPH, fuel waxing "paraffin" from crude petroleum stops the engine! We keep a small leak proof bottle of gasoline safely secured in the trunk. You merely empty the small gas can into the tank dissolving the wax right to the engine pump. You can now start the car and you are on your way. No tow truck needed on I-94.



Next, we change the oil, filter and complete service EGR system including hand wash, vacuum full tank of diesel fuel at no charge every 3,000 miles. Why? This is 1981. Cylinder wash occurs in a diesel, meaning the fuel and containment wash down the cylinders diluting the crank case oil. No diesel engine will run very long when denied service . . . understood and owner accepted. Notes: Don't let women fuel a diesel. One drop on clothes or shoes can smell all day. New diesel owner orientation and dealership tour is mandatory before delivery. Attention to yellow "WAIT" lamp for glow plugs heating. If you insist on fast ignoring wait lamp starts, you can cook twin starter motors at \$300 each and run down twin batteries.

Never buy diesel fuel from prolonged storage in above ground tanks. Temperatures reaching 60-70 degrees F can cause formation of hydrogen sulfide causing premature engine failure so should be avoided. Illustration: Cadillac diesel from Toledo to within 33 miles of Jacksonville, Florida, or Toledo, Ohio, to Wichita, Kansas, 889 miles on one tank of diesel fuel all based on EPA driving. How about a 3 year lease on new diesel Sedan DeVille for only \$399 a month?

My diesel knowledge was experienced hands on in Vietnam! The 1st Mobile Communication Group's mission is "rapid deployment in our C-124" to remote often hostile "top secret" combat zones. The 1st MOB highly skilled personnel were among the U.S.A.F. most decorated. Heavily involved in

the Vietnam war, we were armed and prepared to defend our navigation aids, radar, GCA, TACAN, crypto vans and "diesel" power units. All OUR vans require critical precise 60 cycle current. Southeast Asia is 50 cycle. Local power is unusable. 5 KW through 100 KW diesel power units were vital. The VC are not stupid. When blue vans were operational, military aircraft arrive including helicopters. If the VC puts rounds (bullets) in our power units causing power failures, air crews could die! If the VC puts rounds in us, lights out!









### CADILLAC UNBRIDLED DIESELS PLUS THE V-8-6-4 DRAMA




The 1981 Cadillac V-8-6-4 modular displacement engine and electromechanical system shuts off the valve train of a particular pair of cylinders on its 368 cu. In 6-0-liter 140 HP at 3800 RPM. By mechanically altering the rocker arm

fulcrum, the intake and exhaust valves are held shut by their valve springs. No fuel passes through those combustion chambers. M.D. Cadillacs employ all eight cylinders 60% of the time, 6-3% and 4-37%.

EPA projects Cadillacs run on four 88% of the time. The 8-6-4 is Cadillac's new digital fuel injection system. A twin-injector throttle body metered by a digital microprocessor electronic control module (ECM). The V-8-6-4 was available in 1981 only.









I purchased a new 1981 V-8-6-4 Coupe DeVille pictured here and I had a 1981 Seville demonstrator. In the 6 cylinder mode, it vibrates through the drive shaft (RWD) temporarily. FWD was no problem. The press killed it and the 1963 Corvette split window coupe. Most owners simply disconnected the 8-6-4 wire (RWD) to the transmission for a great V-8! If this engine is so bad, how come it was standard in all RWD Cadillac limousines for seven years? Benz now successfully uses an 8-6-4!

The Massey Cadillac diesels remained a huge success. Our Cadillac owners were thrilled especially the lady owners and drivers that generated impressive repeat and referral business in a highly competitive market. Mr. Massey remained "The nation's largest most successful Master Cadillac Dealer." One of my thoughts has always been *You cannot build a business with unhappy owners!* On that point, Mr. Massey and I were in agreement! It was proven again when I was a Master Cadillac Dealer at Beloff Pontiac Cadillac GMC in Peru, Indiana, 1973, at age 32. I have loved cars since I could crawl. My greatest experience in life was selling all kinds of cars and keeping my owners happy. See alexbeloff3.com for my 159 cars.

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
