George W. Bush Library Visit



Steve and I, along with our friend Dan Harrison, thoroughly enjoyed our outing with the North Texas Region Cadillac & LaSalle Club to the George W. Bush Library. Approaching from the North on Central Expressway, signs clearly directed us to exit and turn on to SMU Boulevard. Close parking is across the street, with overflow parking only a block away.

After passing through security and purchasing our tickets, we saw exhibits of lavish gifts to the President and Mrs. Bush from foreign countries. Next, we passed into an open foyer, where every 15 minutes, a 3-D introductory film displays above your heads. It is a very realistic representation of active Americans that rotates around the room then

appears to "freeze" into etched images of limestone.

Saving the exterior patio with the statues of the two Presidents Bush for last, we began our self-paced journey through the exhibit area. A smart-phone app is available which turns a phone into a headphone-like device, but we chose to read the descriptions on our own. At several points, there are small seating

areas with short video presentations. There is campaign memorabilia, facts about the 36 days of the Bush-Gore election outcome, informational displays about issues during Bush's presidency, exhibits on women's and humanitarian issues, and even displays of Laura's dresses. A twisted beam



from the World Trade Center is surrounded by exhibits about 9/11. In the Decision Points room with computer monitors, you and your group choose a conflict (such as Hurricane Katrina or Saddam Hussein), hear expert reports/opinions, vote on how you would have responded, then hear President Bush explain how he responded and why. There are several hands-on educational activities for young people as well.

Of course there is a reproduction of the Oval Office where you can have your picture made sitting in the President's chair and a lovely replica of the Rose Garden. We took our pictures in front of the Presidents' statues, checked out the gift shop, and left for a delicious Italian dinner at Campisi's.

The museum does a wonderful job of informing the public about George W. Bush and his presidency.



Future Cadillacs

The Spirit of Cadillac Moves Boldly Ahead

Since 1903, the name Cadillac has signified leadership in well-designed automobiles renowned for comfort, convenience and ultimate luxury. This heritage of excellence is already being shaped for the future by the advanced technology and design of Voyagé, Cadillac's newest concept car.

Voyagé is more than a stylist's dream come true. It is a functional, working prototype where many of Cadillac's newest concepts in aerodynamic design, performance, handling, comfort, and convenience are being researched and developed on a continuing basis. Voyagé is really a four-passenger test plotform that is allowing Cadillac engineers to more quickly develop and incorporate new features into the automobiles that Cadillac owners may be driving in the years ahead.

These "bullet-type" vehicles may travel on computer-controlled superhighways with speeds of 180 MPH — where driving 65 MPH might be considered the *minimum* safe driving speed!

Aerodynamic Design

At higher speeds, aerodynamics are vitally important for stability and fuel economy. Voyagé achieves a .28 coefficient of drag, making it one of the world's most aerodynamic — and uncommonly quiet — gasoline-powered vehicles. Voyage's moveable front-wheel skirts serve a dual purpose. During normal driving, the wheel skirts stay tucked smoothly into the fenders to preserve the clean, aerodynamic lines and low drag. However, when sharp turning maneuvers are required, the wheel skirts extend out to allow full wheel turning.

The upper surface of the car, from the base of the windshield to the bottom of the taillamps, is a continuous piece of smooth, high-impact, tinted glass — which provides both strength and greater all-around visibility. The side window of Voyagé is curved and bent — to allow it to serve as both an aerodynamically functional and styled element of the vehicle.

Advanced Safety

At speeds approaching 200 MPH, the ability to see — and be seen from long distances by other drivers — will be very important. Voyagé is equipped with highintensity, light-emitting diode (LED) taillamps and turn signals that provide ample warning to approaching vehicles. Lamps are hidden under the glass and form a continuous strip, broken only in the middle by a rear-vision video camera. The camera is used to alert Voyagé's driver to ancoming vehicles by projecting their images on a color monitor located in the instrument panel. Automatic high-visibility flashers replace reflectors on Voyagé. When parked at night, and approached by another vehicle with headlights on. Voyagé's flashers automatically activate to aiert the driver of another vehicle's presence.

For improved nighttime visibility, electrochromic outside/inside rearview mirrors automatically dim to reduce glare from the headlights of approaching cars.

Windshield wipers are concealed. When needed, the entire wiper mechanism rises on its own elevator. A cover panel opens briefly to allow the wiper arms to extend into operating position. This design provides improved styling and aerodynamic integrity.

Powertrain Performance

Voyagé is powered by a high-performance version of Cadillac's acclaimed 4.5 litter V8 engine, which was introduced on 1988 De Ville, Fleetwood, Eldorado and Seville. Extremely well received by both customers and automotive writers, the new 4.5 litter engine features major modifications for Voyagé that significantly increase airflow capacity and compression ratio, while lowering exhaust restriction for freer breathing.

As a result, Voyage's port fuel-injected engine develops nearly double the horsepower (275 HP) and almost a third more torque (330 lbs.-ft.) than the current


