


Awarded Best CLC Regional Newsletter 2007-2008

June Happenings

On a scorching hot day on the cusp of July, 1,300 plus cars of all makes and styles set up a car show at the Frisco, Texas FC Stadium. Cars could register as themselves for a spot in the various show fields, or as a club where like minded owners could park together. The entire production, the first year for this event, billed as the **2013 Texas Dream Cruise**, was a multi-charity activity, benefit-ing **Boys & Girls Clubs of Collin County, North Texas Military Association**, and **City House**. Its inspiration was the Woodward Dream Cruise in Detroit. The North Texas Region Cadillac & LaSalle fielded five Caddys, one shady Cadillac tent, one Cadillac feather, and three stuffed animals. Members Bill "Lifer" Levy, Neil Jefferson, Ron Fishell, Charlie Bross, and Jim Warren parked their Cadillac rides for display and judging opportunities. During the afternoon the whole crew boarded Jim's 49 Cadillac and we cruised all the lots, viewing the cars. Other cars from all over did the same cruising all afternoon.

Many visitor, both from the NTXCL club and friends we made at the many cars shows we attend through out the summer dropped by to say HI, cool off, and enjoy the show. Among the many guests we had on our Cadillac row was Andy Stone from Tulsa, OK, and way too many more to list. The producers estimated that over 15,000 spectators were there, and future goals is to be the biggest car show event in the state of Texas. And it really could happen.

Based on the available parking space that was not used up, we think the NTXCLC can make a fantastic showing next year. Lets plan on it.



Technical Discussion

In the past number of years automotive manufacturers have been trying to both cut costs and reduce the weight of their products in order to meet Corporate Average Fuel Economy (CAFÉ) requirements put in place beginning in 1975. This was a result of the 1973 Arab Oil Embargo. One of the ways they tried to accomplish this was to build smaller vehicles and use smaller, more efficient engines. Another has been the lack of or the reduction of insulation in most cars, SUVs, and vans to reduce weight (and, of course, cost). Insulation affords a few benefits in a vehicle. It quiets the interior, improves the HVAC, and it improves the sounds of the entertainment systems. However, the auto manufacturers have been using more radio speakers to increase the sound waves in the interior to drown out body, road, and tire noise.

I wanted my 2001 Cadillac Eldorado to be quieter, and have a more solid feeling. When I shut the hood, doors, or trunk lid, it sounded like a cheap Chevy or Plymouth; hollow and tinny. On the road it was fairly quiet, but there were tire sounds, and distant noises coming through the doors and floors, just like most cars. I wanted SIELENCE when I drove. I used to drive tanks and jeeps and flew reciprocal engine airplanes in the Army, and I had enough loud, wild noises. I also used to own big Cadillac boulevard cruisers that allowed no outside sound to come in. That's what I craved. I want some peace and quiet.

I purchased a couple of boxes of a sheet materiel that has an adhesive back, a butyl lining, and aluminum outer cover facing. It is easy to shape to the surface you apply it to, easy to cut, and easy to apply. What it accomplishes is to reduce a sheet metal surface from vibrating, dampening the surface, along with adding a non-yielding surface. This prevents panels facing the outside from transmitting noise and vibrations, thus silencing the interior. As an added benefit it helps keep the interior cooler in hot weather and warmer in the colder weather by reflecting the heat or cool on the aluminum surface. For cars that transmit a lot of heat through the firewall, it would be useful, hidden under the dashboard area to block that heat.

So, I did the trunk, doors, and floors. The most difficult part was getting this sticky sheet through the small holes in the door frame and putting it on the door's inner side. Then I added more to the door frame as my hands quit bleeding, covered the access holes with sheet metal and damping sheet, added a new rain shield and now the doors shut with a thud, not a clunk. The trunk was easier, but you have to reach and crawl in to get good coverage. The floors require removing the seats, carpet retainers, carpet, and some seat belt items. But that covering is easy.

Now when I cruise down the highway I now hear my radio, set nice and low, easy to listen to. My Bose speakers are mellow, not distorted. I don't hear the road or my tires, (or even the cop's siren on my rear trying to pull me over -- bummer...). I now have my coveted silence. I still need to access and do the rear quarter panels, but I will use a specialized, non-expanding spray material that does the same thing. I used some in the trunk area already and it was easy to hit some hard-to-reach areas.

One note is this material is not seen, only works behind the scene. It could be used for most any car. Although the sheets are adhesive-retained, instead of automotive stuff that is place in and easily removed, it is in for the life of the vehicle and is tough to remove. The surface must be clean, and you can't be covering up rust holes. It is meant for good surfaces. Fix, paint, and clean before applying.


