



Al Gitelman June 4, 1923—May 21, 2014

Al Gitelman was born June 4,1923 in Brooklyn, NY to a Russian-born father and Vienna-born mother.

Al and his buddies left college to volunteer to do their part in World War II and remained in the service until it ended in 1945. While with the 29th Division he was in a PT boat in Normandy on June 4th awaiting word to proceed to the Landing on Omaha Beach June 6th. (Al states, per his wife Mary, that some call it the Invasion but the 29th called it the "LANDING") As they finally received word to proceed to the beach, suddenly they were quickly ordered to get back and get off the beach. Those that returned said it was very hard to look back at all the bodies of the soldiers lying in the water. Some of these memories that Al has were captured in the movie "Saving Private Ryan." Al never wanted Mary to see the movie.

Al received three Purple Hearts during his years of service. Last year on October 1st he was awarded the Medal of Chevalier, Honor of the French Order of Legion by the French Consulate in Dallas.

Upon returning from the service, Al traveled a lot, coming to Dallas in 1949. He worked and represented a Photograph Co of New York. This company also made the camera used by Jimmy Stewart in the film "Rear Window." He later owned his own business - Tapestry Import from France -located at the World Trade Center for 20 years.

Al's brother planned a birthday party for Al on June 4 1954 and introduced Al to Mary. Mary had come to Dallas from Bentonville AR to work at the Mercantile Bank. Three months later, on September 8,1954, they married and spent 60 years of good times together. Several years after they were married their daughter Caron was born. (Continued on page 2)

Besides his wife Mary, and daughter Caron, horses and car were another of Al's loves.

At the age of 90 Al returned with a few of his buddies to attend the Normandy Landing----(Invasion) to celebrate the D-Day on June 6. But before that they were walking on the beach touring when Al fell in a fox hole breaking his shoulder. Much to Al's disappointment he missed the celebration. So he was looking forward to maybe returning this year at the age of 91 to celebrate the 70th Anniversary of D Day.

However, Al fell broke his hip on Tuesday, May 13. He had surgery but did not respond very well, and after surgery died on May 21, 2014.

He is survived by his wife Mary and daughter, Caron Grant. Also a sister residing in Florida. Al is preceded in death by parents and his two brothers.
