PATE Swap Meet Month

Its that time of year again when the sixteen car clubs that comprise the Pate Swap Meet Association gather in late April to put on the largest swap meet in the Midwestern United States, and possibly the second largest in the country. This is the 47th year of this annual event, and the North Texas Region of the Cadillac & LaSalle Club is a major player. This four-day event, which took many months of hard work by members of the member car clubs, has everything in the way of automobiles, motorcycles, and most anything transportation related, including parts of all kinds, accessories, automobilia, street rods, hot rods, antiques, classics, and loads of hard-to-find vintage items.

The NTX mission is very important, as we are responsible to lay on the ground in eight zones, a special marker for each vendor space so the vendors who paid for their space can locate it. This year we are trying a new tile marker that has a vinyl sticker overlaid on a rubber marker tile. There are approximately 9,300 tiles, each hand-prepared by members of three car clubs, and hand-laid in the proper

position on the Texas Motor Speedway west parking lot on the Saturday before the week of the swap meet. On the last Sunday of the swap meet all tiles are recovered, sorted, missing tiles noted, and then stored for the next year's swap meet.

We are also responsible to mark the streets with 133 street signs so vendors and patrons can find their way around this massive site. Before they are set out, PVC poles have to be corrected from the previous year and made ready. Each 6-foot sign has two streets marked, and is screwed into in a concrete base that weighs about 50 pounds. These signs are set up by a NTX crew that has plenty of muscle. On the last day of the swap meet the signs have to be taken down and stored for another year.

Why do we do it? Because we are part of a large active organization that has the same interests we do. It's hard work, and it's fun. The fun part comes on the swap meet days when we see old friends and greet new ones who come by our vellow and white hospitality tent on the corner of Andretti and Third Street, when we sign up new members, and when we show off some of our Cadillacs on display in front of our tent.

These pages will have some pictures of our work and thank you for those who helped and participated. If you didn't make it this year, try to schedule some time for next year, as we would love to have you aboard.

PATE SWAP MEET TILE PARTY



Located in Pate Swap Meet Director Dave Anderton's repair shop, forty-six people from three different car clubs worked diligently for about two and one half hours (a new record for this event) to place the vinyl number overlay onto approximately 9,377 old and new 6" X 3" rubber tiles. This was the first year for the vinyl stickers, printed in numerical order on a number of rolls, with a self-adhesive back. The ability to handle the weather and the abuse they will receive while on the ground at the swap meet is yet to be fully tested.

The shop was well lit, and comfortable to work in, and after all the work was completed, a lunch was served by the NTX club. Here are the members of three clubs who volunteered their time, effort, and skills to make this event a success.

As a quick note, a number of vendors complimented us on the new space tile markers. Easier to read, and less prone to wind-flipping due to the added weight of the vinyl sticker.


PATE Swap Meet Setup

There is nothing like arriving early in the morning by Gate 4 of the Texas Motor Speedway and greeted by 42 tubs of vendor space-marking tiles, 133 street sign units, wind, cold wind, and more wind, and a few sweets to get the day moving. Due to traffic problems in I35W, our 47 workers finally arrived and after an orientation by NTXCLC Pate Swap Meet Director Bill Levy, assignments of duties and the issuing of eight golf carts, instructions on new walki-talkies, and issuing of maps and tubs, the setup day began. Fighting the strong cold wind and new parking lot markings, we finished up at about 3:00 p.m. with some minor work left for the next week. All in all, it was a good work effort and a lot got done.

A hard-working skeleton crew made up of **Bill Levy, Harriett Goodfriend, Ron Fishell**, and **Chris Jesson** put in another eight hours mounting signs on the sign poles, final review and auditing of the space tile markers for correct placement, adding addition missing tiles along the ditch rows, and adding addition signs on 3rd Street Ally. And as the tent company mounted our hospitality tent at Andretti Avenue and 3rd Street, we felt a job well done and complete. Already for the big swap meet.

GEE, OUR OLD LASALLE LOOKED GREAT

Turns out the old line that car buyers only care about the size and quantity of cup holders isn't true. According to a 2017 study from J.D. Power, the top reason shoppers buy a specific model is the vehicle's exterior styling. This beat out reliability, price, fuel economy and even safety.

When did Americans begin to pay attention to car design? In the automobile's early years consumers accepted their Ford Model T or Chevy 6 as nothing more than a way to get from point A to point B. That changed 90 years ago this month, when General Motors unveiled its 1927 LaSalle—the first assembly-line car designed by a stylist rather than an engineer.

Harley Earl, the LaSalle's designer, was only 33 when the LaSalle first hit American roads, but he was already a visionary. Earl's career path came into focus during a family outing in 1910, according to the Automotive Hall of Fame. The 16-year-old, who would later work in his father's carriage shop, "found a clay-filled hollow" near his family's campsite and "sculpted the clay into fantasy cars more elegant than any that existed at the time."

Like Earle, Alfred Sloan wasn't satisfied with cars being simply functional. The General Motors president knew of Earl's custom bodywork for stars like Fatty Arbuckle, and hired him to create something snappy for the roaring '20s. From sketches to mock-up, it took Earl three months to design the LaSalle. Upon its debut the New Yorker magazine called it "as refreshing as a Paris frock in a Des Moines, Iowa, ballroom."

It was as colorful as a peacock, too. Three years before, the DuPont Chemical Co. had developed a fast-drying, polychromatic finish. A LaSalle buyer could choose from an astonishing 482 color combinations of two- and three-tone paints, according to Tim Pawl, curator of the Cadillac LaSalle Club Museum.

In the first year of the LaSalle's 14-year run, GM sold nearly 17,000, prompting Sloan to create the Art and Color Section of GM. He tapped Earl to lead the new section and assimilate art and style into the auto maker's full line of vehicles. The company's engineers scoffed, calling Earl one of the "pretty picture boys" and deriding his 50-person department as a "beauty parlor."

The insults didn't hamper Earl's productivity. By the time his 32-year career came to an end, he and his GM design team could claim credit for the onset of annual styling changes, the first modern concept car, the wraparound windshield, the hardtop sedan, the Chevrolet Corvette, and the soaring tail fins of the 1950s. Art critic Dave Hickey wrote in his 1997 book "Air Guitar: Essays on Art & Democracy" that Earl changed car marketing from "being about what they do to what they mean." Earl's farsightedness was evidenced by the 1956 Buick Centurion concept car that incorporated a rearview camera—an option that wouldn't become available until 2002, decades after his death.

Earl's legacy is substantial. He was inducted into the Automotive Hall of Fame in 1986. The winner of the Daytona 500 brings home the Harley J. Earl Perpetual Trophy. In 1999 the Detroit Free Press ranked Earl as the third most significant Michigan artist of the 20th century, just behind Aretha Franklin and Stevie Wonder.

That's fast company.


